Learn how to compost alongside **Master Composters Mary Hogue** and **Dan Martens** from the Sustainable Fairfield Task Force. They will demonstrate the best ways for you to successfully recycle food scraps in your back yard, leaving you with a rich compost that helps to return valuable nutrients to the soil and improve the quality of your garden and lawn. Compost is a natural fertilizer that improves soil aeration, controls weeds and reduces the need to water.
