



## Piano Repertoire in the Age of Romanticism

The 19th Century bore witness to a remarkable series of changes in the evolution of western music. Piano repertoire serves as an elegant microcosm of this phenomenon. Beethoven's death in 1827 gave way to great melodists including Schubert, Schumann, Mendelssohn, Chopin and Liszt. During this program, Professor **Gil Harel** will analyze various piano works from the 19th century, discussing their musical attributes and demonstrating how they epitomize the spirit of romanticism.



Presenter: Gil Harel, PhD is a musicologist, music theorist and awardwinning professor currently teaching at Naugatuck Valley Community College. A Fairfield resident, his commitment to community-oriented learning spans many years. He has been a featured speaker throughout Connecticut, New York and Massachusetts.
