Georges Seurat (1859–1891) based his art on scientific vision research and believed that the placement of colors could influence a viewer's emotions allowing the brain to mix small adjacent daubs of colors (sometimes called Pointillism), to perceive a result more vividly than by seeing those colors premixed together. Join us as we examine his work.

This is the 2nd program in Michael Norris' *Postimpressionists* series following the very popular *Go Van Gogh* presented in November 2022. Each presentation is separate and there is no need to have seen previous presentations.
